- Experiences in California State Parks
- Reach communities who may face challenges getting to or enjoying parks

#### **Qualifying applicants**

- Government
- 501(c) 3

- Executive Summary
- Applicant Background
- Program Details
  - Describe the issues affecting the community's access to state parks and beaches. What is your organizations' prior involvement on these issues?
  - What approaches will you take to create solutions to the issues you described? What specifically will the participants do and what are your transportation plans?
  - Tell us about the participants program experience and duration.
  - We are living in unprecedented and unpredictable times due to COVID-19. Tell us about your contingency plan to meet safety guidelines?
  - Tell us how your program cultivates a lifelong connection with California's parks and nature?
  - Does environmental stewardship play a role in your program? If so, how?





- Consider the emotional and health of your participants
  - Pre-outing virtual gatherings
  - Cleaning supplies
- Be open and transparent about concerns and needs to lead programs
- Flexible and adjust timelines to meet program goals
- Parks California is committed to the safety of your community and park staff
