Adventure Pass Program Overview

- Assembly Bill 148, signed by Governor Newsom in July 2021, established the California State Park Adventure Pass Program, a three-year pilot program.
- In November 2023, California State Parks, in partnership with First Partner Jennifer Siebel Newsom and the California Natural Resources Agency, is expanding its popular California State Park Adventure Pass from 19 to 54 select state parks.
- The program provides free entry to 54 state parks throughout the state for fourth graders and their families for a full year, September - August.
- The initiative supports children's physical, mental, and socioemotional well-being, which supports students' academic outcomes.
- The pass waives day use fees for an entire vehicle.
 Additional fees associated with park activities are not covered.











Park Pass Access Tips

2023 Adventure Pass Grants Program

- Supported 12 Organizations, through grant awards totaling
 \$327,925 for projects beginning February 1, 2023
 - 9 Adventure Pass Pilot Sites
- Preliminary data from 5 completed projects:
 - 765 4th graders and family members participated in programming through 16 park visits



2024 Adventure Pass Grants Program

Goal:

We aim to support transportation, programs and activities needed for 4th graders and their families to explore California State Parks.

Criteria:

- Proposal must connect 4th graders and their families to a California State Park or Beach.
- The California State Park or Beach must be one of the 54 participating in the Adventure Pass pilot program.
- Participants must include underrepresented communities who may face challenges getting to or enjoying parks including but not limited to low-income, physical and/or emotional disabilities and/or People of Color.
- Provide participants with transportation solutions, resources, and support needed to take full advantage of the Adventure Park Pass.
- Program provides relevant experiences for participants in State Parks.



Preference will be given to programs that:

- Provide participants with multiple, meaningful, and relevant outdoor experiences.
- Have history in engaging and offering programming for underrepresented communities who may face challenges getting to or enjoying parks including but not limited to - low- income, physical and/or emotional disabilities and/or People of Color.
- Build on an existing partnership or collaboration with California State Parks.





Grant Period:

May - August 2024

Recommended Request Amount:

• Up to \$10,000

Qualifying Applicants:

 501(c)3 Organizations, CA Native American Tribes, Native 7871 Organization, Fiscally-sponsored Community Organizations, and Government Agencies.

Application Due Date:

March 25, 2024

Applicant Coordination with State Parks

Coordination with State
Parks staff is required **prior to submitting** a grant
proposal. Our intent is to
encourage conversation
and collaboration.

Applicants will be **required** to submit the name and contact of the State Parks staff member they spoke with.

During the application review process, Parks California will **confirm** that each District is aware of the proposed projects in their respective parks.
