In response to natural disasters including 2023 storm damage at Seacliff & New Brighton State Beaches and the 2020 CZU fire, Parks California is seeking representatives to coordinate community engagement events to inform ongoing planning efforts for California State Parks.

Parks California's **Community Grant Program** is designed to **amplify diverse voices**, ensuring that historically underrepresented communities and those who've had limited engagement with our parks are at the heart of the planning process. This is your chance to help bring new perspectives, experiences, and ideas to the table!



SANTA CRUZ COMMUNITY GRANT PROGRAM

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Organizations rooted in and connected to communities of color and economically

disadvantaged communities are encouraged to apply for funds to bring groups to State Beaches in the Santa Cruz District. These groups will share their ideas and views on how to create future coastal recreational facilities that increase equity in access and create inclusive park experiences; as well as facilities that are resilient with future coastal processes.

Areas include <u>New Brighton</u>, <u>Seacliff</u>, <u>Manresa</u> and <u>Sunset</u> State Beaches, and the <u>Rancho</u> <u>Del Oso unit</u> at Big Basin Redwoods State Park.

Park visits can be single or multiple day use visits and/or an overnight experience.

Please check State Park websites for park activities & facilities as you plan your programming.

We are seeking proposals that address the following criteria:

- Gather participants to engage in inclusive park planning conversations with Park staff
- Offer a valuable recreational, environmental, cultural or historical learning experience at Seacliff State Beach, New Brighton State Beach, Manresa State Beach and/or the Rancho Del Oso unit at Big Basin Redwoods State Park
- Reach underrepresented communities who may face challenges getting to or enjoying parks, and/or lack opportunities to create meaningful connections to nature

OPTIONAL

Park Resource: Check out <u>FamCamp</u>, a free program that supports group camping at State Parks! (in-person training required)

Awards will be granted up to \$8,000 depending on group's identified needs. Funding is intended to support stakeholders in consulting and organization of community engagement opportunities.
